STILLNESS OF THE DISCERNING IN BIHAR

BIHAR has never been short of noise. Certainly not when it mattered. Its politics has marched through history with a daring swagger — JP's call that shook New Delhi, Mandal's churn that redrafted power, the long years of Lalu raj that jolted the old order. Even the subtler Nitish era made bold strokes on the canvas, turning India's polity yet again with the caste census narrative and grand alliance politics.

Yet this election arrives on soft feet. On November 5, the campaign for the first stretch of 121 constituencies is winding down, and the battle for the remaining 122 — those border districts where sentiment often travels across rivers and frontiers — will begin soon. And through it all, there hangs a curious quiet.

Whether in Nitish Kumar's native Bakhtiyarpur, or hamlets like Gauspur and Chitapur fringing Patna, whether in Dalit 'tolas' where caste is still geo-tagged or along the mobile 100-km sweep to Gaya on NH-22, out in villages like Barachati and Tekari near where a legend named Dashrath Manjhi once moved mountains, the stillness is audible. Even in places like Mokama where bullets flew the other day, or Barh, which saw fisticuffs after this writer left, the action is all on one slim band where politics does its business. The people seem unmoved. Almost cold.

This is not indifference. It is an extended pause — a thinking state, perhaps it's the hush of crores of people thinking harder.

The old Bihar election grammar is still here: the woven caste alliances, the search for the right symbol atop the right community, the deft stitching of booth workers and social equations. But listen closely, and the dialogues are shifting pitch. It is no longer enough to promise representation; people want opportunity. Bihar's young — impatient, painfully aware of the ticket-to-life stamped "migration" that's been their lot for years, and now uniformly literate about the ways of the world beyond their panchayat WhatsApp group — are asking sharper questions.

Identity of the other sort has not dissolved; only its fabric has thinned in the face of this new common identity, an identity of experience. Numbers are never incidental here. OBCs and EBCs together form roughly two-thirds of Bihar — a demographic truth that still underwrites strategy. Yadavs remain the single biggest OBC bloc, Kurmis and Kushwahs count in pockets where one village's mood can bend a seat, Dalits and Mahadalits together hold a weight politicians can never ignore, and the elite castes — though numerically modest — continue to influence candidate choice and the political discourse, particularly in the plains.

IN an extraordinary moment for diversity in American politics, three Indian-origin Americans carved history across key states signalling a possible new era in the United States.

Zohran Mamdani became the first Indian-American and Muslim to be elected Mayor of New York City. Ghazala Hashmi was chosen as Lieutenant Governor of Virginia, and Aftab Pureval secured a second term as Mayor of Cincinnati. Together, their victories mark a milestone in the growing political influence of South Asian Americans.

At just 34, Zohran Kwame Mamdani's stunning win has made him New York City's youngest mayor in over a 100 years and the first of Indian heritage to hold the post. Running as a Democratic Socialist, Mamdani triumphed over two formidable opponents, former governor Andrew Cuomo, contesting as an independent with the backing of President Donald Trump, and Republican Curtis Sliwa. With 83% of votes counted, Mamdani secured

948,202 votes (50.6%), while Cuomo managed 776,547 (41.3%). The city saw a record turnout of nearly two million votes, the highest since 1969.

Born in Kampala, Uganda, Mamdani moved to New York at the age of seven. His mother, acclaimed filmmaker Mira Nair, and father, Columbia University scholar Mahmood Mamdani, have long been symbols of cultural and intellectual achievement.

In his victory speech, Mam-

dani called his win a "mandate for change," thanking his parents and wife, Syrian-American artist Rama Duwaji.

His campaign, which resonated with young and working-class voters, centered on reducing living costs, expanding housing, and improving public transport—a continuation of his progressive record as a Queens assemblyman, where he introduced a pilot programme for free city buses.

AFTER seven-and-a-half decades of Independence, electrical lights have illuminated the houses of 17 tribal families in the remote Gudem hamlet of Alluri Sitarama Raju (ASR) district, thanks to the proactive initiative of Deputy Chief Minister (Panchayat Raj and Rural Development) Pawan Kalyan.

The electrification project, completed in just five months, marks a historic milestone for this isolated hilltop settlement under Rompalli Gram Panchayat in Ananthagiri mandal. On Wednesday, coinciding with Karthika Pournami, all 17 houses in Gudem got electricity connections.

The project involved laying power lines over 9.6 km through dense forest and rugged terrain, installing 217 electric

poles, and setting up a dedicated transformer. Each house was provided with five bulbs, and one fan free of cost.

The hamlet, situated 50 km from the mandal headquarters, had remained cut off from basic infrastructure like roads, safe drinking water and electricity. Residents lived in constant fear of wild animals at night, and relied on lanterns.

Despite repeated appeals to authorities over the years, no solution materialised until the tribals took their woes to Pawan Kalyan's notice five months ago. Moved by their plight, the Deputy CM directed the ASR District Collector to prioritise electrification of the hamlet. He coordinated with Energy Minister Gottipati Ravi Kumar and APEPDCL CMD Prithvi Tej for the speedy execution of the project at an estimated cost of ₹80 lakh. **P4**

ACB conducts searches at 12 sub-registrar offices

FOLLOWING numerous complaints of rampant corruption in sub-registrar offices (SROs), the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) carried out simultaneous surprise checks at 12 SROs across the State on Wednesday.

More than 20 ACB teams raided SROs at Jagadamba Centre, Pedagantyada and Madhurawada in Visakhapatnam district, Bhogapuram (Vizianagaram), Ibrahimpatnam (NTR), Narasaraopet (Palnadu), Ongole (Prakasam), Stonehousepet (Nellore), Renigunta (Chittoor), Rajampet (Annamayya), Chilamathur (Anantapur), and Allagadda (Nandyal).

During the searches, unaccounted cash ranging from ₹10,000 to ₹75,000 was found at Bhogapuram, Jagadamba Centre, Ibrahimpatnam, Ongole, Stonehousepet and Narasaraopet SROs. A total of ₹4 lakh unaccounted cash and several documents were seized during the ACB raids. **P4**



GoM studies demands for 8 new districts

RESPONDING to a surge in public appeals, the Group of Ministers (GoM) on district reorganisation met at the State Secretariat on Wednesday, and studied the feasibility of creating eight new districts in Andhra Pradesh.

While acknowledging the widespread demand, Revenue, Registration and Stamps Minister Anagani Satya Prasad clarified that only proposals offering tangible administrative advantages would move forward. "Our priority is to ensure governance becomes more accessible and efficient," he said. Acknowledging the NDA poll promises, Anagni said they too are being taken into consideration.

The GoM also looked into several proposals for new revenue divisions, especially in areas where existing headquarters are located over 125 km away. These proposals were evaluated with a focus on citizen convenience and operational viability. **P4**

THE Centre has issued a notification to promote the sustainable exploitation of fisheries within India's Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ).

The newly introduced rules, titled 'Sustainable Harnessing of Fisheries in the Exclusive Economic Zone Rules, 2025', focus on licensing, registration, and scientific monitoring of

fishing activities in the EEZ. They seek to encourage sustainable mariculture, including seaweed cultivation, reduce fishing pressure, create new livelihood opportunities, and enhance overall marine production. The rules recognise Fisheries Cooperatives and Fish Farmer Producer Organisations (FFPOs) as key stakeholders in managing the EEZ.

In addition, the government



will provide training and capacity-building for traditional and small-scale fishers, including fisheries cooperatives and Self-Help Groups.



Woman delivers baby aboard train

A woman passenger travelling on the Prashanti Express (Train No. 18464, SBC-Bhubaneswar) delivered a baby boy on board early on Tuesday, prompting swift assistance from the Railway Protection Force (RPF) and station staff at Anakapalle railway station.

As per RPF Circle Inspector (CI) Srinivasa Reddy, a message was received at 9.30 am from the Deputy Station Superintendent at Anakapalle, reporting that a woman in the S4 coach, berth number 64, was in labour pain and required immediate assistance upon the train's arrival.

"The train reached Anakapalle at 10.09 am, where RPF Assistant Sub-Inspector P Venkati Babu, on-duty staff members, and licensed woman porter B Laxmi attended to the passenger, identified as Sunita Chatar of West Singhbhum district in Jharkhand. By the time they reached her, she had al-



ready given birth to a healthy baby boy with help from her husband and two women Travelling Ticket Examiners," the CI revealed.

The woman's husband informed officials that the couple had boarded the train at Dhone and that his wife had begun experiencing labour pains around 7.30 am, eventually giving birth before reaching Anakapalle.

"An ambulance was arranged immediately, and both mother and child were transported to the Government Hospital in Anakapalle. Medical authorities confirmed that both were stable," the CI added.

Meena warns negligent excise officials

Excise Director Chamukuri Sridhar ordered data-based reports on toddy production and prompt action on pending cases. Enforcement Director Rahul Dev Sharma instructed liquor registration in the Suraksha App and vigil against illegal distillation.

BR Naidu highlights major TTD pilgrim-friendly reforms

TTD Chairman BR Naidu on Wednesday termed his one-year tenure as a "satisfactory and enriching experience," saying the board took key decisions to enhance the sanctity and services of the Lord Venkateswara Swamy temple at Tirumala.

Addressing the media in Hyderabad, he said the board prioritised protecting the temple's religious sanctity by removing non-Hindu employees in line with legal provisions, a move welcomed by the global Hindu community.

Action was initiated against political speeches and false propaganda, hurting the devotees' sentiments. He said the feedback system by AP Digital Corporation was launched to gather suggestions.

"We reclaimed 25 acres around Tirumala, including Alipiri Zoo Park and Muntaz Hotel sites, from the Tourism Department. We have also amended religious laws to curb commercial activities and promote spiritu-

al programmes," he said, adding that the regularisation of contract drivers and lecturers with over 15 years of service is in process.

Naidu said that TTD would build one temple in every state capital and build 5,000 temples in Dalit, Harijan, and fishermen colonies in AP. He said measures were being taken to curb online fraud, including the setting up of a cybersecurity lab in Tirumala.

He said proposals were sent to rename Renigunta Airport as 'Sri Venkateswara International Airport,' with plans to give it a temple-style design.

TTD has allotted ₹131 crore to boost SVIMS Super Speciality Hospital, including the recruitment of medical staff.

"We are reviving the AI-based darshan system to ensure devotees complete darshan within two hours. Under the new EO, Anil Kumar Sing-

guiding them back into forest areas. Chittoor District Collector Sumit Kumar said plans are under way to develop Musalimadugu into a major tourist hub with facilities such as washrooms, drinking water points, and seating areas, all adhering to wildlife board norms. He recently inspected the site and directed forest officials to prepare a detailed development plan.

Speaking to *TNIE*, Chittoor Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Subba Raju said, "The Deputy Chief Minister will officially inaugurate the Musalimadugu Kumki Elephant Training Camp, most likely coming Sunday. After the inauguration, visitors will be allowed to visit the camp to learn about human-wildlife conflict and understand the nature and behaviour of tuskers."

The camp serves as the base for trained elephants - provid-

ing facilities for their acclimatization, training of mahouts, and maintenance infrastructure. It will now be upgraded as an eco-tourism destination, allowing visitors to observe the elephants' behaviour, food habits, and interactions with humans.

The camp houses three trained elephants — Krishna, Jayanth, and Vinayak — brought from Karnataka to assist in managing wild herds that stray into farmlands. Fa-

cilities at the camp include feeding kitchens, fodder storage, water sources, and solar fencing to prevent animal intrusion.

Officials said the site serves as a training base for mahouts and forest personnel involved in Kumki operations. The initiative forms part of the Forest Department's efforts to reduce human-elephant conflict, which has intensified in recent years in southern Chittoor.

The Collector said the welfare of trained elephants remains a top priority, with proper fodder, medical care, space, and environmental enrichment being ensured in line with national guidelines.

Once operational, Musalimadugu is expected to emerge as a key eco-tourism centre promoting community awareness, conservation education, and sustainable coexistence with wildlife.

CM urges industrialists to lay a strong foundation for future growth

CHIEF Minister N Chandrababu Naidu has called for a shared sense of responsibility between the administration and industrialists to build a strong foundation for future generations.

He was speaking at an event where the Institute of Directors, London, conferred the Distinguished Fellowship 2025 on his wife, Nara Bhuvaneshwari, in recognition of her contributions to sociological initiatives, Heritage Foods, which she heads, also received the Golden Peacock Award for excellence in corporate governance.

In his keynote address, Naidu expressed pride at his wife's recognition and said the growing partnership between India and the UK, strengthened by the trade cooperation agreement signed in July, reflected the evolving global economic order. He stressed that governments and organisations must recalibrate their vision to match global trends, particularly in the age of rapid technological change.

Highlighting Andhra Pradesh's forward-looking policies, Naidu said the upcoming

Google AI Data Centre in Visakhapatnam will serve as a catalyst for innovation, research, and skill development. "Technology should always be used to improve living standards," he said, citing the Montha cyclone response as an example where real-time data helped minimise casualties and property damage.

SAEL to invest ₹22k cr in renewable, data and port sectors in State

IN a major boost to Andhra Pradesh's clean energy and industrial growth, SAEL Industries Limited has announced investments worth ₹22,000 crore across renewable energy, biomass, data centres, and port development. The projects are expected to generate 7,000 direct and 70,000 indirect jobs across the State.

SAEL Industries, a leading player in renewable energy with an expanding footprint in data and port-linked infrastructure, has already commissioned 600 MW in just nine months, demonstrating strong execution capabilities as it scales up operations under the new MoU with the State government.

The MoU outlines a multi-sector pipeline covering utility-scale solar and storage, biomass-based power, a hyperscale-ready data centre, and port-linked infrastructure aimed at boosting industrial and logistics efficiency.

Seven solar and Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) projects totalling over 1,750 MW are proposed across Kadapa and Kurnool districts. These include NHPC and SECI-linked projects designed to ensure

round-the-clock renewable power for industries and data centres.

Under the MoU, SAEL will bring investment, technology, and design expertise, while the APEDB will facilitate approvals and coordination. Procurement of paddy to be transparent

CIVIL Supplies Minister Nadendla Manohar said the government ensured justice to farmers through transparent policies and timely payments, unlike the previous regime.

Addressing the media in Vijayawada, he announced the State is ready to procure 51 lakh metric tonnes (MT) of paddy this Kharif season, worth ₹12,200 crore. A total of 4,041 Farmer Service Centres, 3,803 procurement centres and 16,700 staff have been mobilised, with six crore gunny bags readied.

Payments to farmers are now made within 48 hours, to be reduced to 24 hours soon. The department will use Bluetooth-enabled moisture metres to ensure transparency. From January, rice cardholders will get 1 kg wheat flour at ₹18, while 50,000 tarpaulins will be distributed to safeguard crops.

TO MAKE OUR STREETS SAFER, FOLLOW SUPREME COURT ORDER ON STRAYS

IFE is cheap in the animal world. In Bengaluru, a caretaker recently slammed a chihuahua to death in an apartment lift; during Diwali, some miscreants tied crackers to a dog's legs and exploded them, while others stuffed a dog's mouth with fireworks and set them alight. In our anthropocentric world, horror stories of animal abuse pop up regularly. This happens even after activists have brought about a major shift in laws to curb animal cruelty—under Section 325 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, killing or maiming an animal attracts five years in prison, a penalty, or both. However, the provision is observed more in breach.

At the heart of the hatred for animals lay fear and the conflict over sharing habitats. Chilling incidents of packs of dogs mauling children and senior citizens, and rising cases of rabies have made them targets. This August, a Supreme Court bench stayed another bench's decision to move all strays in the National Capital Territory into shelters after a petition showed it ran counter to the Animal Birth Control (Dogs) Rules, 2023; instead, it ordered all states and Union Territories to report back after creating dedicated feeding spaces for strays. When none did, in a rare move earlier this week, the top court summoned and upbraided all the chief secretaries, who tendered an unconditional apology.

The act of feeding street dogs itself sparks a furious debate in cities. While animal lovers claim it blunts aggressive canine behaviour, others warn it increases the menace. The Bengaluru authorities' plan to provide one nutritious meal a day at designated feeding locations for the city's street dogs—a step farther than the Supreme Court's order—can put the debate to rest. It can prevent dogs from forming aggressive packs to hunt for food. Revitalised vaccination and sterilisation programmes, which suffered during and after the pandemic, will also help. Maintaining demarcated habitats for larger animals is itself proving to be a tough ask for governments at a time human habitats are expanding and animal conflicts are on the rise. At least in our cities, we will have to come to terms with the fact that dogs are here to stay. The Supreme Court's order, itself the result of a careful consideration of the dangers, cannot be wished away. In its spirit, the motto should be to live and let live.

REDISTRICTING WIN MORE WEIGHTY THAN MAMDANI'S

A series of blue waves broke on America's east and west coasts on Tuesday. The one that crashed ashore in New York swept in Democrat Zohran Mamdani as the second-youngest mayor of America's largest city. Though Trump reminded the world that he was not on the ballot, it's amply clear from the exit polls that Trumpism was. To drive home the point, Mamdani addressed the president directly in his victory speech: “Donald Trump, since I know you're watching, I have four words for you: Turn the volume up!” The 34-year-old of Indian descent also invoked Jawaharlal Nehru's ‘Tryst with destiny’ speech to ring in the new. However, in a political ‘swamp’ where one becomes more centrist the higher one floats, it remains to be seen how many path-breaking promises—from free bus rides, and rent freeze for more than 2 million tenants, to universal childcare—this avowed democratic socialist gets to keep once he takes oath on January 1.

More than Mamdani's election, the wave that swept up the west coast will perhaps be more consequential for America's national politics. The passing of Proposition 50, a ballot measure to redraw congressional districts in the country's most populous state, gives Democrats an edge in overturning control of the narrowly-held lower house of Congress. It also boosts California Governor Gavin Newsom, who has already thrown his hat into the 2028 presidential ring, among Democrats. The party that was pushed out of a host of top offices by Trump's red wave in 2024 will savour the gubernatorial wins in Virginia and New Jersey, and the Supreme Court wins in Pennsylvania, too.

Tuesday's elections set the precursory mood for the mid-terms next year. However, in signs of caution among the Democratic establishment, Barack Obama and Chuck Schumer, the seniormost New Yorker in Congress, did not endorse Mamdani. Meanwhile Trump, who had warned of defunding the city if it elected Mamdani, can be expected to raise the volume of anti-immigration rhetoric. If it results in a rightwing backlash like what happened after Obama's win, it might imperil millions of Indian Americans in these more polarised times. It would send a signal to anti-immigrant politicians around the world, too. The trouble is, a ferment that happens in America rarely stays in America.

TEACHER'S 100

An educator's greatest triumph is the success of his students. Seen as such, filmmaker Ritwik Ghatak, whose birth centenary is being marked this week, lived many lifetimes through his illustrious students—Kumar Shahani, Saeed Akhtar Mirza (given the middle name by Ghatak himself), Adoor Gopalakrishnan, Mani Kaul, John Abraham, Subhash Ghai and Asrani among them. His stories—for Bimal Roy's *Madhumati* and Hrishikesh Mukherjee's debut *Musafir*—earned as many accolades as his own directorial ventures such as *Jukti, Takko a Gappo* (*Reason, Debate and a Story*) and *Meghe Dhaka Tara* (*Cloud-Capped Star*). Perhaps the maestro's predicament was reflected in a 13-minute short, *Rendezvous* (1964), that he supervised for FTII student R N Shukla, in which a woman waits for her paramour—only to be spurned.

THE term ‘ideology’ has made a comeback to dominate the Indian public and political landscape in the last few years. It had become somewhat less fashionable since the early 1990s, but had a faint revival in 2014, when the Bharatiya Janata Party came to power. It found greater traction and mobility ever since the BJP sealed its dominance in 2019.

If ideology, as a somewhat rigid set or system of ideas, has seen a resurrection in more recent years, it can be argued that the reason is not the BJP, but the Congress. Since the Congress, under the leadership of Rahul Gandhi, began to perceive the BJP more as an intransigent ideological machine and less as a political opposition, it too began to devise a stubborn ideological response at the opposite end of the spectrum. From being a party with definite ideas and principles, it began to fancy being ideological.

This response pattern has been a kind of global playbook, and therefore Rahul Gandhi definitely came before Zohran Mamdani; but, for distinct reasons, their levels of success have varied. Anyway, this ideological game witnessed a new flashpoint in the last few days.

First, Priyank Kharge, son of Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge and a minister in Karnataka, wrote a letter to his own government demanding that the RSS's activities in public places and government premises be regulated, if not banned. Next, Kharge Senior took the idea to Delhi. On October 31, he asked for banning the RSS.

The Congress seems to believe that to debilitate the RSS, often described as the ideological parent or mentor of the BJP, is to checkmate the saffron party. It may never have such a clear and straight outcome, but it is an assumption not without some logical basis. Interestingly, when Mallikarjun Kharge said he would prefer the RSS to be banned, he clarified that it was his “personal view”. Kharge Senior may have appeared diffident and treaded cautiously, but the idea had become the party's mainstream opinion before he became the party's president.

Rahul Gandhi's blunt assertions on the RSS and its mentors have often got him into legal trouble. In May 2022, he had said, “My fight is with the ideology of the RSS and BJP, which is a threat to our country. I fight against the hatred and violence these people spread.” Again, in January 2023, he said he would never enter an RSS office, “I'll have to be beheaded before that. My family has an ideology.”

The Congress is getting more ideological while trying to counter the BJP and the RSS. It can learn from Ambedkar, whose pragmatism made him focus on the art of the possible

WHEN THE GRAND OLD CENTRIST PARTY MOVES TO A SIDE

In Karnataka, this ideological battle finds new expression every now and then. In the latest round, the Congress government is allegedly allocating government land at subsidised prices to the Congress Bhavan Trust across the state in over a hundred places. When the BJP was in power in the state, it had allocated large tracts for its own party offices and to RSS's affiliate and sympathetic organisations. Now the Congress is doing something similar as an apparent ideological counter, although legally it may be in troubled waters.

Interestingly, the Congress did not cancel the land allocation the BJP had made to itself and its affiliates; on the contrary, it made it an ideological *raison d'être* to allocate itself more land. This has been revealed in detail by *The File*, a site that

uses RTI as its primary investigative tool.

Despite such ideological battles that the Congress endeavours to construct across the nation, ironically, the RSS and BJP have always visualised their mission as cultural and civilisational. They do not use the registers that overtly communicate an ideological strife. It is always about cultural and civilisational recovery, restoration and rebuilding; about setting right historical injustices, imagined or real.

When the Congress gets ideological, when it operates at the extremes of what it assumes to be progressive politics, then its liberal claims get dented. Any firm ideological position acquires a certain blindness, militant idiom, and exclusivity. It begins to rapidly judge even reasonable and rational concessions to the other. It begins to brand and shame those

AN UNSUBTLE ART OF PERSUASION

KERALA is a small state. One end to the other can be covered in less than 20 hours by road. And everywhere you go in this congested state today, you will see mostly one person smiling at you: Pinarayi Vijayan, Chief Minister of Kerala and leader of the Left Democratic Front, now in the last leg of its second consecutive term in power.

The thing with power is that it must be seen as doing good to perpetuate itself. Few understand this better than Prime Minister Narendra Modi. All of India is Modi's mirror. We see him as he sees himself, everywhere. He is the source. He is not merely seen as doing things, but as giving things.

The visibility of power is exponentially greater in smaller states. Kerala's CM, through relentless self-promotion, has achieved a seemingly god-like status. If he is not cutting ribbons at events, he is giving things away to the needy. To the brave, he gives medals. To the poor, he gives money. To writers—and there are many of them in Kerala, a state that famously produces more writers per capita than anywhere else in India—he gives golden shawls. Never mind the tropical humidity.

Vijayan smiles at you from large hoardings by the roadside and across green paddy fields. He hangs from bridges. He looks at you from behind speeding buses, from newspapers, from stages. He is everywhere. He inaugurates lower primary school sports events, university arts festivals, free-speech seminars, and literature festivals. Everywhere, Vijayan is seen as giving.

In Gerontion, T S Eliot talks about history as full of “supple confusions” and, because of that, its “giving famishes the craving”. Something similar is at work here, but it's not Vijayan's fault. This is how power works. He, like Modi, is a relentless exponent of the art.

When the LDF government celebrated the first anniversary of its second term, it generously gave itself ₹15 crore to spend. By the fourth year, the year-round celebrations were allotted over ₹100 crore, according to reports. The government's public relations department cleared ₹25.91 crore for a blitz, of which ₹15.63 crore was reportedly earmarked for 500 hoardings featuring the CM. It's as if the face of the leader has become the single-most urgent infrastructure project in a state struggling with mounting liabilities.

True, compared to states like Uttar Pradesh, Karnataka, Rajasthan, or And-

hra Pradesh, the scale of self-promotion—and the money spent—may appear modest. But Kerala's total outstanding debt is projected to reach around ₹4.65 lakh crore by the end of 2025-26. Government finances remain strained; there are periodic reports of delays in salary and pension disbursements.

Yet, there is money for what can only be called a cultural frenzy—especially art and literature festivals. There are scores of them, from the panchayat to the district and state levels. The Kerala Literature Festival, for example, is substantially funded by the government. The event is usually inaugurated by the CM or prominently features him. The point is simple: every so-called cultural window frames just one face—Vijayan's.

Before the assembly elections next year, the effectiveness of this new visibility should be known from the local elections due this month

The Vijayan government's love for the arts is not accidental; it is strategic. Power has always found a way to consolidate and flourish by co-opting artists and writers. And many writers in Kerala are willing participants—for both historical and career reasons.

The Left played a vital role in Kerala's reformist and progressive movements from the 1940s onwards. By the 1950s, the

communist movement had brought about a rare marriage of humanist politics and the arts, resulting in an explosion of great works in literature, theatre, and cinema.

As a result, there persists a traditional assumption that Left politics is *a priori* fashionable. Most writers in Kerala find it difficult to adopt an independent or critical stance towards the government. Then there is the survivalist problem: if you alienate the Left establishment, awards, fellowships, and academic appointments turn elusive. The LDF's reach is so deep that even the police force often functions like an extended party network.

There are other government-sponsored extravaganzas too—such as Keralaaleeyam, which celebrates the formation, development, and culture of the state. Independently as well, there have been events like a mass dance three years ago, where about 500 women dancers choreographed a tribute to Vijayan as the source of all that is good.

Last month, when Mohanlal was honoured with the Dadasaheb Phalke award, the government lost no time in holding a public event to felicitate the actor. Reportedly, ₹2.84 crore was spent on the celebration, and ₹1 crore of that came from the Diamond Jubilee Fellowship for Young Artists—a fund meant to nurture emerging talent. Vijayan presided over this thinly-disguised cross-branding exercise. Giving often is taking, too.

Last week, there was yet another government celebration—this time to praise itself for having achieved “extreme poverty eradication”. Of course, Vijayan was there, along with a frail-looking Mammooty, endorsing the government.

The assembly elections are scheduled for April-May 2026, but one doesn't have to wait that long. The local body elections, due this month, will offer a preview of what lies ahead. The Congress-led opposition makes the right noises, but infighting has crippled it. Nor does the Congress have any clear economic or development strategy for the state. A third term for the LDF would mean more of the same face. Isn't that great!

who are non-aligned. Therefore, the casualty of the Congress's ideological nature could be the near-decimation of a moderate, a centrist, and even a classic liberal. This again has become a global feature.

Studies have shown that the ideological divide in the US has become more consolidated since 2008, while the gradual disappearance of moderates in Republican and Democratic parties happened between 1976 and 2008. The rise of Zohran Mamdani as New York's mayor-elect may force the Democrats to move deeper leftwards from the centre. There is an enormous difference between the Bernie Sanders kind of socialism and the one espoused by Mamdani, who is more cultural.

In India, too, Rahul Gandhi has tried to mix socialist economic ideas with caste identity politics, but has not been effective for a variety of reasons. People do not see the Congress as loony ideological, but as an inheritor of a certain kind of conservative centrism. But Rahul has even used a liberal Constitution as an ideological wand to be waved.

One wonders why the Congress, which has taken interest lately in constitutional icon B R Ambedkar, has not paid sufficient attention to his ideas of pragmatism. Ambedkar, according to his biographer Ashok Gopal, did not believe in the “finality of thinking” or “ultimate truth”, but argued that “in political negotiations the rule must be what is possible”. Ambedkar did not want a compromise on principles, but said once the principle was agreed upon, “there can be no objection to realising it in installments”. Ambedkar felt that such graduation in politics was inevitable, and in some circumstances advantageous. The Congress's ideological hardening does not accommodate this nuance, but attempts an instant revolutionary flavour.

British writer and academic Raymond Williams wrote that the term ‘ideology’ was used in a pejorative sense first by Napoleon, as a kind of “abstract, impractical and fanatical theory” to characterise the French revolution. That characterisation has remained in popular argument. Marx and Engels, too, used it to mean ‘illusion’, ‘unreality’ and ‘false consciousness’ in some of their writings. Williams also pointed out the distinction that has historically been made between ‘ideology’ and ‘science’.

In this light, the Congress party may benefit from deliberating how much ideological positioning is good for it, and how much to embrace pragmatism and principles. (Views are personal)

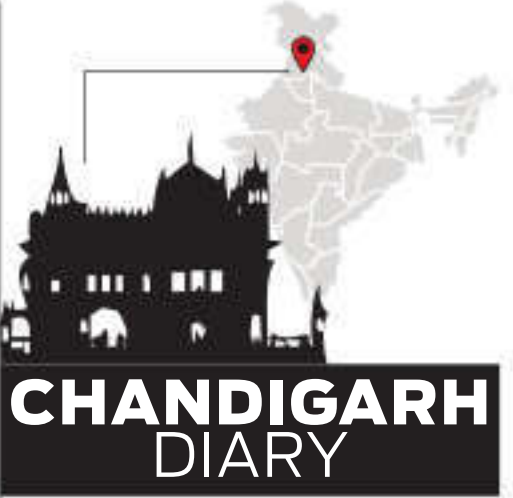

promises made earlier, but we know we have miles to go for Bihar's growth," he said.

He stressed that the people of Bihar had immense faith in both Nitish Kumar and Prime Minister Modi, describing both leaders as having "a clean image." Pradhan said voters would not allow "jungle raj" to return, recalling the difficult years under the Lalu-Rabri regime.

Attacking the opposition, Pradhan said leaders of the INDIA bloc, including those from the Congress and RJD, were fac-

ing corruption charges. "The main battle will be between the NDA and the Mahagathbandhan. Fringe players will fail to make any impact," he said.

Referring to the opposition charge that the government transferred ₹10,000 to women's accounts ahead of the elections, he said the claim was "baseless." The NDA has been taking steps for women's empowerment for the last two decades, he said, adding, "This is not about elections, it's about consistent governance."

Looking ahead, Pradhan said the NDA's focus after returning to power would be on attracting investment and creating opportunities for youth through skill development. He said education would remain a top priority. "We can make India a developed country by 2047 only if we invest in education. We have already given Bihar two central universities and 19 Kendriya Vidyalayas. Bihar is now a priority state for NDA," he said.

TEJASHWI Yadav stands at the pivot of this transition—bearing a surname thick with history, and yet determined to build a politics whose vocabulary begins not with past entitlement but future dignity. His rallies have energy, his phrasing has a way of finding the young and speaking to them. In the village alleys, you hear a new sentence: "Chance toh milna chahiye." A chance must be given.

Across the aisle, Nitish—visibly ageing, visibly weary—remains, remarkably, a comfort choice. This is something adjacent to loyalty; more like habit, the trust evoked by an old armchair. For a state whose told stories have travelled the arc from chaos to order and back through impossible political contortions, a known form of stability still commands an instinctive nod. His alliance with the BJP brings an electoral machine that can calculate with the cold precision of algorithms. But the BJP's quiet ambition glimmers beneath its dutiful partnership: a desire, someday, to govern Bihar not by the consent of allies but on its own steam.

The Congress lingers at the edge—a



memory, a partner, a seeker of relevance in a landscape it once defined and now must negotiate seat by seat.

Thus Bihar stands at a crossroads marked not by fury but by thought. The shouting has dimmed. The electorate may not be bored or disinterested, it is discerning. A state long animated by political passion has chosen—at least for this moment—reflection over rhetoric. In a pause.

Still waters do run deep. Bihar may simply be listening to itself before it speaks again.



Mann questions delay in land allotment to AAP

Punjab CM Bhagwant Mann has questioned the Chandigarh Administration for delaying the allotment of land to AAP for its office. Mann said AAP had applied to the Punjab Governor, who is also the Chandigarh Administrator, but no action was taken. He said the party had fulfilled all conditions and deserved land as a national party. Mann criticised the BJP's "Sheesh Mahal-2" jibe. He said the delay exposed political bias against AAP and urged the administration to follow the rules.

Questions over Haryana Congress discipline move

After long, Haryana Congress has taken a significant step in enforcing discipline. It has set up a new disciplinary committee under Dharampal Malik. President Mallikarjun Kharge cleared the panel to keep order in the state unit. But the move comes at a tense time. Three leaders—Captain Ajay Yadav, Samtap Singh, and Kuldeep Sharma—have spoken out against the state leadership. The unrest follows the appointment of Rao Narendar Singh as state chief and Bhupinder Singh Hooda as Congress Legislature Party leader.

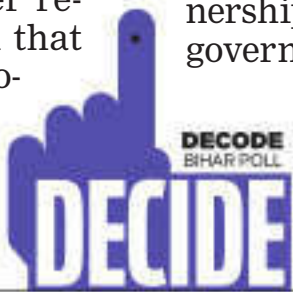
Sanjay Singh, who had been fielded in Munger by JSP, took BJP membership in presence

Army jawan from Gujarat stabbed to death on train, family demands justice

A train attendant stabbed to death an Army jawan, Jigneshbhai Chaudhary, in a moving train on Sunday.

The soldier, from Moti Gidasan village in Vadgam, Banaskantha, was returning home on leave. A minor altercation led to the murderous rage. The brutal killing has left Gujarat in shock, with his family demanding the strictest punishment for the accused and a probe.

Jigneshbhai, a soldier for 12 years, was travelling on the Jammu Tawi-Sabarmati Express after completing duty in Udhampur, Jammu. He was looking forward to reuniting with his family. That homecoming turned into a nightmare.

According to reports, an argument broke out between Jigneshbhai and the train's coach attendant, Zubair Memon, allegedly over a request for a bedsheet.

The small quarrel turned deadly when Memon later returned armed with a knife and attacked the soldier inside the coach. The soldier, caught off guard, was stabbed to death on the moving train. The incident left passengers stunned. Railway Police detained the accused, and the soldier's body was sent to PBM Hospital in Bikaner for a post-mortem.

By Wednesday morning, Jigneshbhai's body reached Chhapai. A huge crowd had gathered for his last journey. People lined the roads, waving the tricolour and shouting patriotic slogans.

His coffin, wrapped in the national flag, was carried with full honour. Soldiers gave him a guard of honour, while his family and villagers wept as they bid him farewell.

Grief turned to anger. His brother Jethabhai Chaudhary said, "We demand justice from the Prime Minister and Home Minister. Bring the accused to Gujarat and hang him."

No forward movement on formation of coordination panel between NC & Cong

DESPITE the recent setback to the ruling National Conference (NC) in the Rajya Sabha polls from Jammu and Kashmir, there has been no progress on forming a coordination committee between the NC and the Congress. The Congress has also decided against joining the Omar Abdullah government, even as the Chief Minister plans a cabinet expansion.

Congress sources said there has been no contact between the leadership of the two parties regarding the coordination committee meant to ensure the smooth functioning of the coalition. State Congress president Tariq Hamid Karra has repeatedly stressed the need for such a committee to streamline governance and address key policy matters.

"Our leaders are presently busy with the Bihar elections. We have not taken up this issue with the NC, and neither has the NC raised it with us," a sen-

ior Congress leader said. He added that the absence of coordination has left several development issues unresolved.

After the NC suffered a setback in the recent Rajya Sabha polls, winning only three seats and losing one to the BJP due to cross-voting, it was expected that the ruling party would reach out to the Congress to expedite the process. "The issue will be taken up on priority after the Bihar elections," the leader said. Congress leaders are also unhappy over being denied a "safe" Rajya Sabha seat despite earlier assurances. The party has decided not to join the government for now. The Chief Minister is planning to expand the cabinet after the bypolls to two Assembly seats on November 11.

Senior Congress leader Ghulam Nabi Monga said, "Our president Tariq Hamid Karra has made it clear that we will not join the government till statehood to Jammu and Kashmir is restored."

PREZ TRUMP BLAMES GOP DEBACLE ON HIS ABSENCE, SHUTDOWN

Democrats' big night in the US stirs pride in Uganda

US President Donald Trump on Wednesday said that the Republican Party lost Tuesday's elections due to his absence from the ballot and the shutdown.

Democrats dominated the first major election since President Trump returned to the White House in January. Democratic socialist Zohran Mamdani pulled off a stunning victory in the New York City mayoral elections, while his party colleague Mikie Sherrill was elected New Jersey governor.

"Trump wasn't on the ballot, and shutdown, were the two reasons that republicans lost elections tonight, according to Pollsters," the US President posted on Truth Social. He, however, did not name the pollsters. The government shutdown has entered its 36th day, breaking the previous record.

In another post, Trump called for voter reforms. "Republicans, terminate the filibuster! Get back to passing legislation and voter reform! President DJT," he wrote. "Pass Voter Reform, Voter ID, No Mail-In Ballots. Save our Supreme Court from 'Packing,' No Two State addition, etc. Terminate the filibuster!!," Trump said in another post.

When Mamdani started his victory



speech, Trump posted, "...and so it begins!" In his victory speech, Mamdani challenged Trump on immigration, heralded the toppling of "political dynasty" and said his election symbolises 'hope' over tyranny and "big money".

In a victory for Democratic party's progressive wing, Mamdani defeated former Gov. Andrew Cuomo and Republican Curtis Sliwa. Mamdani must now navigate unending demands of America's biggest city and deliver on ambitious promises.

Meanwhile, the opposition leader in the Ugandan Parliament sees the Ugandan-born Zohran Mamdani's victory in the New York mayoral race as an inspiring political shift.

"It's a big encouragement to us here in Uganda that it's possible," said Joel Ssenyonyi, who represents an area of the Ugandan capital of Kampala. "But we have a long way to get there." *AP/PTI*

Govt will regulate AI if needed: MeitY secretary

Krishnan says govt will protect people from harms posed by tech

INDIA'S current focus is on fostering innovation in the field of artificial intelligence (AI), and it will introduce regulations or legislation whenever required, said Secretary of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) S Krishnan on Wednesday.

Krishnan, while speaking on the IndiaAI Governance Guidelines Report submitted to the government by a sub-committee under the IndiaAI Mission, said the government will take all necessary measures to protect people from potential and evident harms posed by the technology. "There is a lot of scope for innovation in the AI space. Having said that, let me again assert that if the need arises for legislation or regulation, the government will not be found wanting," Krishnan said.

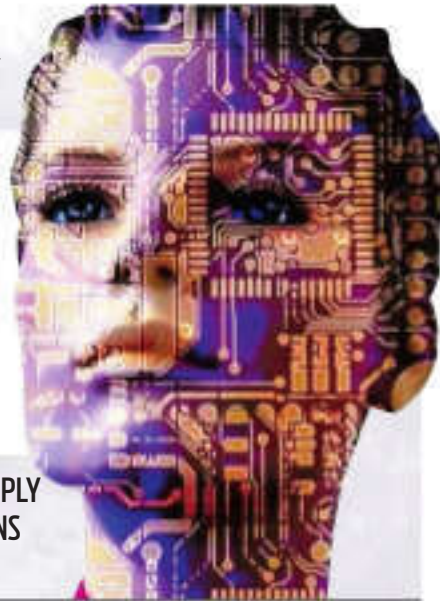

Additional obligations for risk mitigation may apply in specific contexts—such as sensitive applications or those involving vulnerable groups. The report suggests adopting a graded liability system based on the function per-

formed, level of risk, and the extent to which due diligence was observed. Applicable laws should be enforced, while guidelines can assist organisations in meeting their obligations. It also calls for greater transparency regarding how different actors in the AI value chain operate and comply with legal requirements. Krishnan said that India's framework for AI will be developed through extensive consultations. He added that the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) is studying how other countries are addressing AI-related challenges to ensure India's approach remains balanced and adaptable.

Grasim's net profit rises 52% to ₹1,498 crore

ADITYA Birla Group flagship holding company Grasim Industries on Wednesday reported a 52.4% increase in its net profit to ₹1,498.04 crore for the September quarter of FY26, supported by a higher profitability in the cement and chemical businesses.

The company has reported a net profit of ₹982.94 crore for the July-September quarter a year ago, according to a regulatory filing by the holding firm. Grasim's revenue from operations increased 16.6% to ₹39,899.5 crore in the September quarter of FY26. It was ₹34,222.50 crore in the corresponding quarter a year before. This growth in consolidated revenue was "largely driven by growth in building materials and chemicals businesses", said Grasim Industries in its earnings statement. Total expenses of Grasim grew 15.24 per cent to ₹37,795.74 crore in the September quarter.

Total income, which includes other income as well, rose 16.23 per cent in the September quarter to ₹40,244.84 crore.

On a Standalone basis, which primarily includes the India business, Grasim's revenue from operations surged 26% to ₹9,610.34 crore.

Indian manufacturers urge govt to ensure cos source locally-made steel

INDIAN stainless steel manufacturers are seeking the government's help to ensure that sectors like automobile, utensils procure locally manufactured steel, rather than importing cheap steel from overseas. They want the assurance that the relaxation on stainless steel imports, allowing the sale of non-BIS-compliant steel products, won't be extended beyond December 31, so that Indian steel manufacturers can sell their products to the industries.

"Auto and utensils manufacturers should procure steel locally, rather than buying it from Japan, Korea, China and other countries. India has enough capacity to meet demand. Domestically manufactured steel can be used," said Rajamani Krishnamurti, President Indian Stainless Steel Development Association (ISSDA).

The government has extended relaxation on stainless steel imports till December 31, allowing sale of non-BIS-compliant products to ease raw material shortages. This creates a non-level playing field for foreign steel manufacturers, who can continue to supply non-BIS-compliant input materials, par-



ticularly semi-finished products to India, while domestic mills remain bound by strict BIS quality standards. Local steel manufacturers cautioned the domestic industry is buying overseas steel at 20-25% cheaper rate, thus they are not willing to buy locally made steel.

The Steel Ministry said the move was needed due to limited local output, though domestic makers fear prolonged relaxations could hurt long-term market stability. Local manufacturers have assured that there will be no dearth of the output to meet the demand going forward, as they have up scaled their production significantly. Not only for stainless steel, but overall a surge in low-cost steel imports is hurting India's domestic producers. As per media reports, around 150 mills have been shut down and another 50 have cut output.



Indian refiners to cut import of Russian crude after Nov 21

EVEN though Russian crude continued to account for the largest share of India's crude oil imports in October 2025, Indian refiners are expected to reduce their purchases of Russian oil after November 21, according to commodity market analytics firm Kpler.

As per the Kpler data, Russian crude flows to India are likely to remain around 1.6-1.8 million barrels per day (mmbd) until November 21. However, most Indian refiners are expected to comply with US sanctions and halt or scale down crude purchases from Rosneft and Lukoil. To offset the reduction in direct Russian inflows, refiners are likely to ramp up procurement from the Middle-East, Brazil, Latin America, West Africa, Canada,

and the US. However, Nayara Energy's 400,000 barrels per day (kbd) Vadinar refinery, partially owned by Rosneft and under EU sanctions, is unlikely to alter its sourcing strategy.

"We see reductions in Russian crude arrivals after November 21, 2025. Most Indian refiners are expected to comply with US sanctions and halt or reduce crude purchases from Rosneft and Lukoil. This is likely to trigger a decline in Russian crude imports in December, followed by a gradual recovery through mid-to-late Q1, 2026, as new trading intermediaries emerge and alternative routes are established," said Sumit Ritolia, lead research analyst at Kpler.

The US imposed sanctions on Russia's two largest oil producers—Rosneft and Lukoil—in

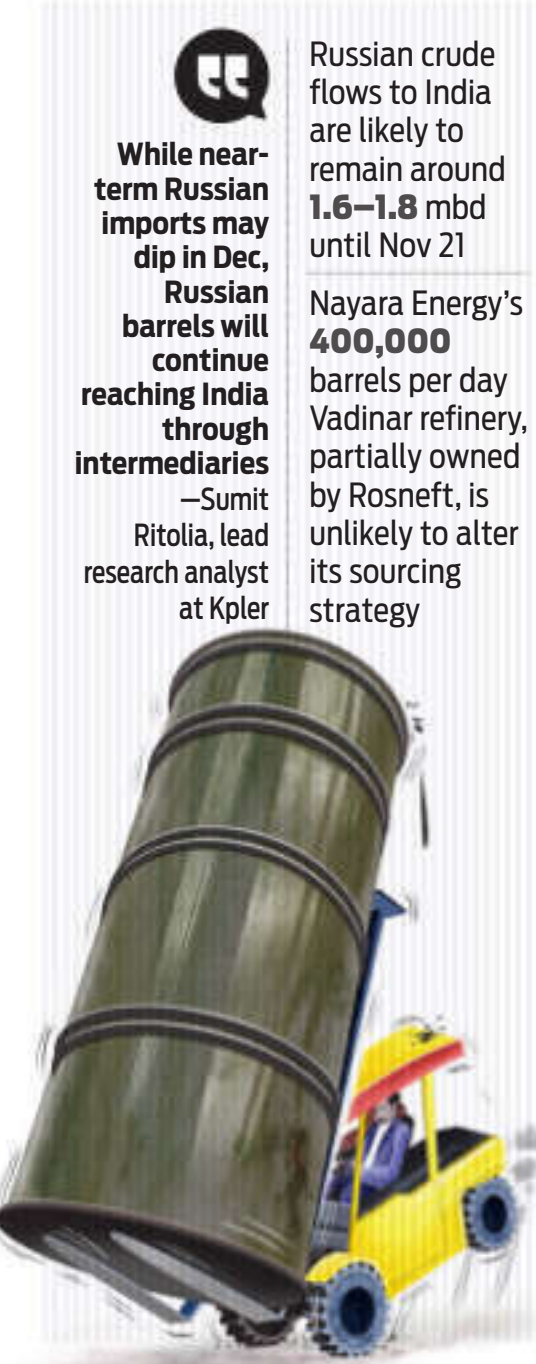
ELECTRONICS components manufacturer, Keynes Technology India Ltd, has announced that its new plant for manufacturing printed circuit boards (PCBs) in Chennai will commence production by the end of this year, with shipments expected to start by April 2026.

During the company's earnings call, Jairam Sampath, Whole-time director and CFO of Keynes Technology, said, "We have received government approval for the second phase of expansion into PCB manufacturing, along with capital subsidy support. The first phase is coming up in Chennai's Oragadam area, and the second phase will be located further south."

The second facility is likely to come up near Thoothukudi in Tamil Nadu. Last week, Keynes was among four companies that received Union government approval for seven

October 2025. Together, these companies account for an estimated 4-5 mbd of global crude exports. As per Kpler, a key trend observed was sharp rise in US crude imports, which rose to their highest level since March 2021. Imports from the US reached 568 kbd in October and are likely to average 450-500 kbd in November, compared with a year-to-date average of around 300 kbd. Kpler said the rise was driven by market economics rather than sanctions.

"Overall, refiners are likely to diversify import baskets, with higher inflows from Latin America (Brazil, Argentina, Colombia, Guyana), the United States, West Africa, and the Middle East. While near-term Russian imports may dip starting in December, Russian barrels will continue reaching India through intermediaries," Ritolia added.

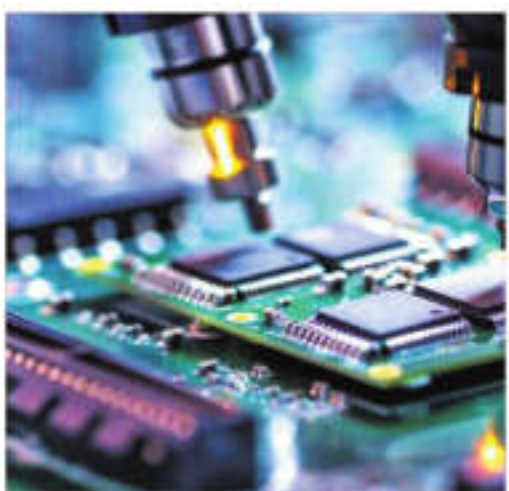

projects under the Electronics Components Manufacturing Scheme (ECMS). The company will produce multi-layer PCBs, high-density interconnect (HDI) PCBs, and flexible PCBs, which are used in telecom, medical, EV, and smartphone applications. Out of the seven projects approved, four were awarded to Keynes.

The company is investing ₹3,300 crore in these projects. Sampath said the focus is on expanding PCB manufacturing capabilities. "At Oragadam, we will manufacture multi-layer

boards, flex boards, and later HDI boards. About 16 customers, including L&T Semiconductor and others, have shown interest in shipping products from April onwards," he said.

He added, "Under PLI scheme, we are covered for six years. Once we ramp up production at the Oragadam Phase 1 plant, we'll move ahead with Phase 2. We have a three-year window to complete Phase 1, and our goal is to handle high-tech PCB manufacturing in-house."

Sampath said while Keynes focuses on design and other ancillary work, the company plans to transfer the entire technology to the Oragadam facility once it achieves the desired level of value addition. For the Thoothukudi project, the company is preparing a detailed project report (DPR). The Chennai plant is likely to start generating revenue within two years, and Keynes is confident that the cash flows from the first unit will support capital infusion into the second factory.

Housing prices see 7-19% rise in third quarter

HOUSING prices across India's top 8 cities rose between 7% and 19% annually in the third quarter (July-September) of calendar year 2025 with Delhi-NCR, Bengaluru and Hyderabad leading the pack with double-digit appreciation, according to real estate transaction & advisory platform PropTiger.com by Aurum Proptech.

The rise in property prices was supported by strong end-user demand in the premium segment, elevated input costs, and a limited supply of quality, ready-to-move-in inventory. Delhi NCR led the pack with

a remarkable 19% year-on-year and 9.8% quarter-on-quarter appreciation, driven by strong demand for luxury properties and infrastructure upgrades. The weighted average price of homes in Delhi-NCR rose from ₹7,479 per sq.ft. in Q3 2024 to ₹8,900 per sq. ft. in Q3 2025.

Bengaluru recorded strong double-digit price growth of 15% YoY and 12.6% QoQ while Hyderabad recorded 13% YoY and 4.6% QoQ growth. The price in Bengaluru rose to ₹8,870 per sq. ft. in Q3 2025 from ₹7,713 per sq. ft. in the same period last year while prices in Hyderabad rose to ₹7750 per sq. ft. in Q3

2025 from ₹6858 per sq. ft. in the third quarter of 2024.

PropTiger in its 'Real Insight Residential: July-September 2025' report stated that other major markets, including Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR), Pune, Chennai, and Kolkata, saw robust single-digit price growth, reflecting broad-based developer confidence and buyers' willingness to invest in appreciating assets.

The report highlighted that home sales across India's 8 prime residential markets stabilized in the July-September quarter, with a marginal 1% year-on-year dip in volume to 95,547 units sold.

State Bank plans to roll out single-window KYC for all products by March

THE State Bank of India is embarking on a major overhaul to cut the cumbersome know-your-customer (KYC) process to a single one across its branches, from around 15 steps now, the chairman of the bank has said.

"We are targeting to complete the process by the end of March 2026, wherein there will be only one KYC verification process under which a customer who has completed the KYC for one service will not be asked to repeat the process for another service from the bank, instead the department concerned will source it from within the bank", chairman CS Setty said, adding that once it gets a unified KYC, it will start a department within the bank to offer "KYC as a service" to various other

functions.

"We realise that there are as many as 15 different ways the e-KYC is being done in SBI alone. So, we want to actually revise our own processes and bring them down to just one," Setty told reporters at the post-earnings presser here Tuesday.

Explaining the cumbersome process followed at present, Setty said each time a customer seeks to access a newer service, like provident fund or a home loan, she/he is forced to do a new KYC every time even though the bank is the same.

The chairman said the effort to streamline KYC is a part of the "Saraal" project launched in July this year and that this is part of the "process reengineering" efforts at the bank which has over 530 million customers.

M3M India to invest ₹7,200 cr in Gurugram

‘Don’t know impact of WC win but knew it was special’

Gomesh S catches up with India batter Harleen Deol to talk about the campaign, what the victory means to her, team and more...

MUSHKIL hai ye batana (Difficult to say), honestly,” laughs Harleen Deol when asked whether the reality of her and the Indian team becoming the World Champions has settled. It had been less than 24 hours since she walked alongside her captain, Harmanpreet Kaur, from the DY Patil stadium at 3 AM on Monday, dancing to Punjabi songs with the winners’ medal around their neck.

In what was an emotionally charged roller coaster of a campaign, Deol and the Women in Blue hung in there, persisted, and course-corrected enough to win their first-ever World Cup. The celebrations continued through the night at the team hotel, and even though the magnanimity of it all hadn’t hit them just yet, they knew their lives had changed forever. “It was like suddenly, when we got up and saw the ground (from the hotel room), the night had changed into morning,” Deol describes the historic night.

On a personal front, Deol scored 169 runs at 33.80 average in five innings before making way for Jemimah Rodrigues at No 3. The Chandigarh-born Himachal Pradesh batter, describes the bubble the team was in, handling criticisms. “Obviously, when things come in our favour, everything fades away.”

In a conversation with this daily, the 27-year-old speaks about how the special victory was for their Harry di (Harmanpreet), the past legends, their families, what the impact of this World Cup would be and more...Excerpts.

■ On waking up the morning after the final as champions It was good, actually. At that time (after winning), we were in a momentum. We were not able to understand things. First of all, we didn’t sleep much. After that, when we woke up, obviously, everything was different.



■ On the winning moment when Harmanpreet took the final catch When Nadine de Klerk hit the shot, my focus was on Harry di. As soon as she caught it, the feeling was very different. Everyone was very excited after that because that was it. Because we also knew that Nadine was a very good player. Previously, she was the one who chased. So, we knew that she was someone who could take the game at any time. When things went our way this time, it was amazing.

■ On the celebrations with Harmanpreet, walking to the hotel at 3 am Actually, looking at Harry di,

it felt better. It was more satisfying for her because it was her fifth World Cup and for us the first one. Obviously, it was a big weight on her. So, looking at her like that, everyone felt good. For so long, this group has been together. Everyone knew that things like this were coming to us. Everyone is very connected. Everything happened together, so it felt very good. And it was all in India, so even better.

■ On sharing the podium with family

When our cricketing journey starts, it starts with them. It is such an exciting thing for them that their kids are playing the World Cup final and we are winning. So, everyone were very excited. Some time ago (on Monday evening), we were talking to our parents about how it was a dream come true, and it still feels like we have seen so much. Along with us, their dreams have come true.

■ On sharing the trophy with former legends like Mithali Raj, Jhulan Goswami and others..

We went for a lap. And all of them were there. It was their dream to break the barrier of winning the World Cup. All of them have worked very hard. If we can play such cricket so easily for so long, it is only because of them. It was their dream too. They worked so hard, and all of them have played with us. Everybody is emotionally involved with every player. The way they celebrated it was an emotional moment for them. To see them like this was quite emotional for all of us.

■ On her campaign, handling outside noise I don’t know. It all depends on how you take things. I didn’t

know what happened. Honestly, I don’t feel connected with social media. We were very prepared for that. We knew it was a home World Cup and there would be a lot of pressure. But it never bothered us. It didn’t bother me. We were so present at that time. We didn’t realise how things are going outside the cricket. We had a proper bubble around us. We honestly didn’t feel those things. But obviously, when things come in our favour, everything fades away.

■ On the three consecutive losses in league stage Those matches were very close. It wasn’t like we were losing one-sided. It was like the game was with us, and at the end, things were different. We believed that it was just the end part where we had to work. When we played the semifinal, we could finish that game. We learned from our mistakes. And obviously, when we lost the England match, Amol (Muzumdar, head coach) sir was very disappointed. Obviously, he has put in so much hard work. He is also allowed to show emotions for the team. We all respected that. We knew that it was good for us. We all took it in a good way. We knew that everything was going to fall into place.

■ On the impact the WC win will have on women’s cricket ecosystem? We don’t know what the changes will be and how they will turn out to be. We are also seeing things. But, we knew that after winning a World Cup, everything is going to change in terms of people and the game. So we don’t know (the level of) impact we have made. But, we know that it’s very special. No women’s team has done that. Like the captain said, we want to make it a habit.

World’s youngest GM stares at crossroads

AND just like that, one of the most promising youngsters has been eliminated in the second round of the World Cup. A few days after revealing to a few national media that he wasn’t satisfied with his progress, Abhimanyu Mishra, the world’s youngest Grandmaster ever, has been shown the door in the second round by AR Salem Saleh.

In a rook-bishop endgame, Salem, playing with Black, was not only up a pawn but his pieces were very active, in sync and controlling both flanks. In the end, Mishra resigned with the engine predicting a mate for Black down the line.

Mishra, who had checked into Goa a day before the second round began (he had received a bye in the first round), had said: “There are many people online and so on who say that in the last four years, my rating should be a lot higher. Frankly, I agree with them. I believe I should be much higher than what I am currently sitting at.”

While it may be hard to understand this from an Indian perspective, the reason why Mishra’s career is at a crossroads is because of a severe lack of corporate or government funding. The elite of Indian chess — D Gukesh, R

Praggnanandhaa and Arjun Erigaisi to name three — have one or both but it’s a far cry for US GMs.

“I have a feeling it’s going to get very difficult soon,” he had said, perhaps prophesied even. “To reach the top, I need resources that I don’t currently have. My family has already spent tons of their own resources. It’s a bit weird in America. There, somehow it feels like chess isn’t considered as much of a sport. We have the St Louis Chess Club (which helps players by organising elite tournaments), and that’s great. But other than that, there’s not that much support in general.

“The main issue, in the last couple of years, is the lack of corporate sponsorship for me. I have been studying eight to 10 hours a day as well (at an online school in the USA). I’ve been living in this way for years. It’s painful, but it’s needed. I spend eight hours a day on chess and slightly more on schoolwork. I am equally good at that as well. In fact, I’m taking advanced courses. I am a straight A student. You look at other players that are there, even at a younger age than me, even from smaller countries... they are all fully funded. And they spend 24×7 on chess. And here I am having to balance both of these things. That’s why my rating has been stag-

nating. I have been stagnating for a while.”

From a rating perspective, it’s fairly clear to see why he thinks this way. After breaching past a number of age-related records, his Elo has seemingly hit a roadblock in the 2640 range. Even as others in his age group have zoomed past that, the US GM with Indian roots has hit a rut of sorts.

It was in this context that he said he ‘would look into it (shifting base to India or another country while continuing to play under the US flag) if things get worse’. But his worry is that even if he breaches past 2700 over the next 4-5 years, making a viable living just playing chess while staying in the US may not be all that. He also plans to further his academics as he plans to do something in fintech.

But the talent is obviously there. At the Grand Swiss, he became the youngest player to take down the reigning world champion in an over-the-board Classical game.

Nepomniachtchi stunned

Ian Nepomniachtchi, two-time World Championship runners-up, was dumped out of the tournament by India’s Dityayan Ghosh. Ghosh, playing with Black, was not only up a pawn (4-3) in a rook endgame but his pawns were in sync so the Russian resigned after 46 moves.

In another upset, Wesley So also lost 1.5-0.5 to Lithuania’s Titas Stremavicius. WI defend 164 to beat NZ by 7 runs

AUCKLAND: The West Indies bowled superbly in defense of a moderate total to beat New Zealand by seven runs on Wednesday in the first game of a five-match Twenty20 series. Captain Shai Hope top-scored with 53 from 39 balls as the West Indies made 164-6 after losing the toss and batting first on a pitch that was unpredictable. No Chhetri in probables list for B’desh tie

NEW DELHI: Indian football team head coach Khalid Jamil on Wednesday announced 23 probables for the inconsequential Asian Cup qualifiers match against Bangladesh and talismanic striker Sunil Chhetri’s name is missing from the list. The game is scheduled to be held in Dhaka on November 18. India are already out of contention for a berth in the main tournament .

Labuschagne returns to OZ squad for Ashes

GOLD COAST: Marnus Labuschagne is back in Australia’s squad to start the Ashes series, with selectors including the veteran batter Wednesday in a 15-man group for the first Test against England. Labuschagne missed Australia’s three-test series win over the West Indies in July after a lean run of form but has impressed in first-class cricket.

Haria, Gupta out of IBSF World Snooker C’ships

DOHA: India’s Dhvaj Haria and Paras Gupta, who were one win away from making the final stage, suffered narrow defeats in the first stage of the IBSF World Snooker Championships. Impressive in his two previous wins, Haria called the shots for the better part of the last-16 meeting against Thor Chuan Leong Tuesday night. However, the 32-year-old frittered away a 3-1 advantage and lost 3-4 to the Malaysian.

TASTE OF BIHAR BEYOND LITTI CHOKHA

IN the light of the ongoing Bihar elections, we travel to the state and discover a an oft-ignored side of it's culinary offerings. *Litti-chokha* and Champaran mutton have been Bihar's culinary ambassadors, but the state has lots more to offer. Be it *chiniya kela* (small banana) from Hajipur or *Shahi litchi* from Muzaffarpur, mangoes like *zardalu* from Bhagalpur or *malda* from Bhojpur, sweetmeats like *balushahi* from Rumi-Saidpur, *pedas* from Khagaria, *khaja* (flaky deep-fried pastry) from Silao or *tilkut* (sesame jaggery discs), *anarsa* (rice jaggery fried sweet) and *kesaria peda* from Gaya; each region has its own specialties. The state's seven GI tagged food items include *magahi paan* and the pepper-shaped *Marcha* rice.

Bihar sees extreme weather – scorching summers with hot 'loo' or dry dusty winds blowing across the Indo-Gangetic plains, winters characterised by *sheetlahri* (cold waves) and heavy monsoons with Kosi's dramatic descent from Tibet/ Nepal making Bihar the most flood-prone state. One wonderfood that defies climatic severity is *sattu* (roasted Bengal gram flour). Consumed in summer as a sweetened beverage with water and sugar or a salty drink with chopped onion and lime to prevent heat stroke, *sattu* also serves as a savoury filling, rolled into *parathas* or stuffed into *littis* that keep you warm in winter. Roasted on a coal fire and dunked in *ghee*, it is served with *chokha*, a smoky brinjal mash with onion, tomato, chilli, lime and mustard oil.

Bihar accounts for nearly 90 percent of the world's *makhana* or fox nut production, mainly Darbhanga, Madhubani, Sitamarhi, Katihar, Purnea, Kishanganj, Araria, Saharsa and Supaul. Cultivation of *makhana* as a cash crop is so important, there's a *Makhana Research Centre* in Darbhanga under the *Indian Council of Agricultural Research*. Mithila's *makhana* was accorded a GI

tag in 2021. A popular local saying celebrates the region's cultural icons: "*Pug pug pokhar maachh makhana, madhur boli muski mukh paan, ee theek Mithilaak pehchan*" (At every step, a pond, fish and foxnuts, sweet speech, a smile, a mouthful of *paan*, this is Mithila's true identity)

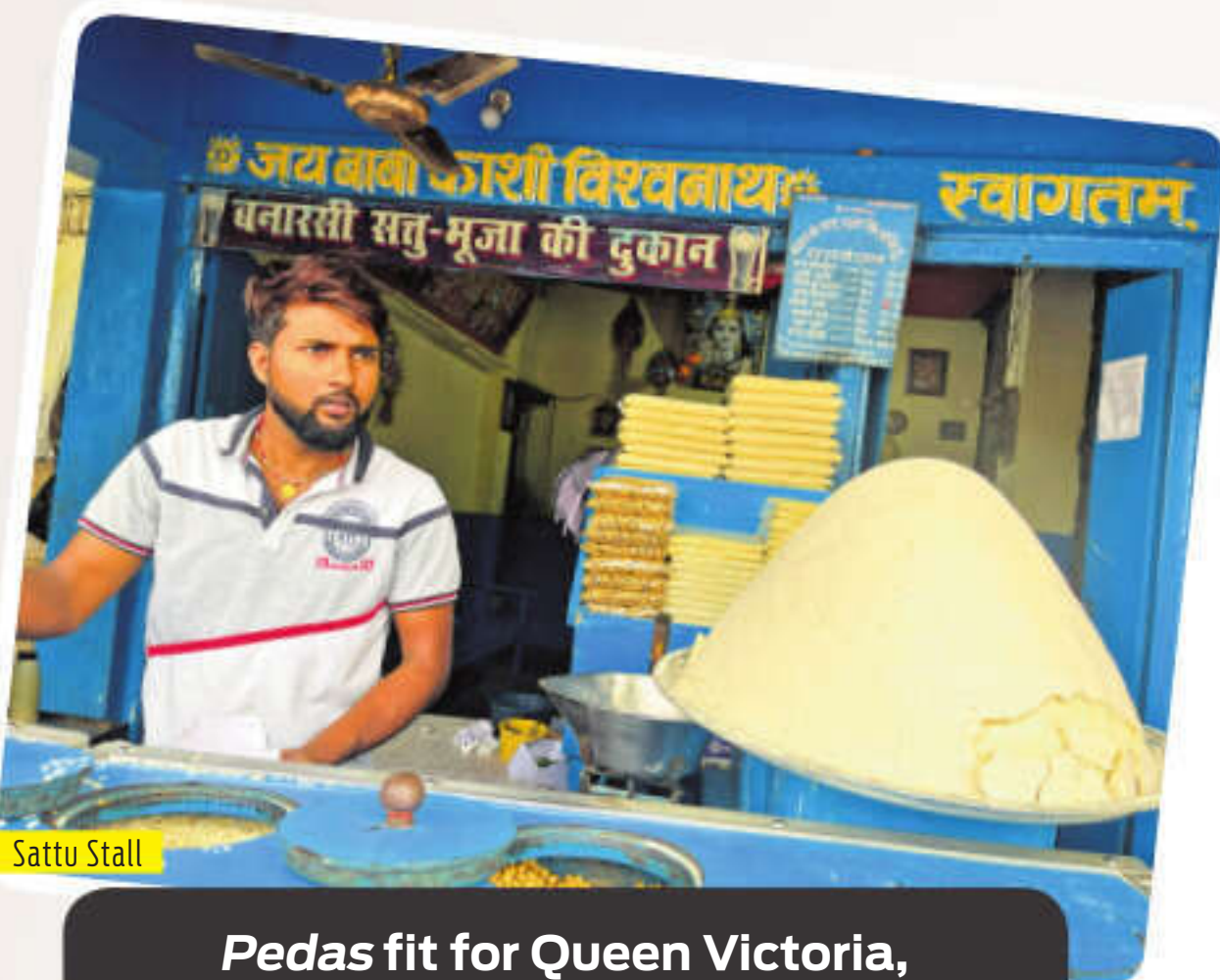
Mithila's love for *chuda-dahi* (beaten rice and curd), fish and mutton curry, is legendary. In Darbhanga, the best place for mutton is Suraj Meat House in Gudri Bazaar, where it is sold by weight (100 rupees for 100 g, minus the gravy) and served with *chapati* and Katarni rice. Grown mostly in Bhagalpur and Banka districts, the special scented short grain GI tag rice is in heavy demand for the *chuda* prepared from it! While in Darbhanga, grab a *lassi* at Hum Lassi Yahin Peete Hain or right across at Dhamaka Lassi. The thick *lassi* comes topped with cashew, raisins, *khao* (reduced milk) and *malai* (cream). Champaran mutton is to Patna what *Ambur biryani* is to Bengaluru; every other shop sells it. Head to the Old Champaran Meat House opposite Taramandal. Try mutton curry at Mirchu Hotel, Bihari *kebabs* at Mahngu Hotel, *kachoris* at Nandu Lal Kachoriwale, *lad-dus* at Maner Sweets, *litti-chokha* at Chourasiya Ji Ki Purani Litti Dukaan near the

station and A1 Chandrakala just below it. Gaya's *kesaria pedas* are steeped in history. Traditionally offered as *bhog* (sacred offering) at Vishnupad temple, the sweet also played a part in the 1857 Indian war of Independence! A British soldier stationed in Gaya took a bite of the *peda* at a local sweetshop and returned the partly-eaten *jootha* (impure) portion back on the platter; a big cultural no-no in the sacred town. An altercation ensued and the infuriated shop owner Badho Sav attacked the troops, killing two British soldiers. Five Gaya residents were sentenced to Kala Pani, the infamous Cellular Jail in the Andamans. On Queen Victoria's birthday, the prisoners were asked if they had any special wish. A defiant Sav prepared his special *kesaria pedas* to be sent to the queen! Impressed by its delicious taste, the queen pardoned them. On returning to Gaya, they resumed their struggle against the British. Today, Badho Sav's seventh generation continues the *peda* making tradition.

Thanks to Bihari migration as indentured labour, staples like *dalpuri* and *achar* assimilated into faraway nations like Guyana, Trinidad and Tobago and Mauritius as '*dhol puri*' and '*achard*' and Bhojpur beats blended with Caribbean calypso to create *Chutney* music. Whether it's wholesome *dal pitha* (lentil filled steamed rice dumplings), *madua* (*ragi*) *roti* with *saag* (greens) or sweet *launglata* and soft *malpuas*, the Bihari palate is an amalgam of tantalising flavours.

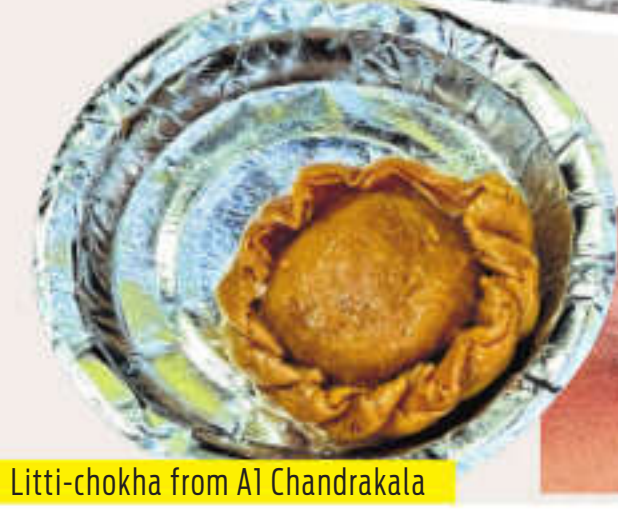

UNESCO INCLUDES LUCKNOW IN THE CREATIVE CITY OF GASTRONOMY LIST!

This special announcement was made during the 43rd Session of the UNESCO General Conference, in Uzbekistan on October 31

LUCKNOW, has been tagged as a *UNESCO Creative City of Gastronomy*, joining Hyderabad as the second Indian city in the category. The recognition honours its rich Awadhi cuisine, centuries-old living food traditions and its use of gastronomy as a powerful driver of cultural exchange and sustainable urban development.

From its famous street foods to its royal kitchen traditions, Lucknow's cuisine has brought together history, innovation and community spirit for centuries. It evolved under the patronage of the Nawabs and is a refined blend of even Indic and Persian cultural influences. The city is renowned for iconic dishes and unique cooking methods, such as the slow-cooked *dum pukht* technique, *galouti kebabs*, aromatic Awadhi *biryani*, rich *kormas* and sweet treats like *malai gilori* and *sheermal*. The recognition also accounts for the vibrant street food culture, where generations of cooks have adapted royal recipes for everyday people in bustling bazaars like Hazratganj and Aminabad, showing a living, evolving tradition accessible to all.

The nomination dossier documented recipes, oral histories from chefs and local families, showcasing a strong community bond around food. Lucknow committed to promoting sustainable food practices, nutrition education and supporting local food producers and artisans, aligning with *UNESCO's* goals for sustainable development.

Lucknow was officially declared a *UNESCO 'Creative City of Gastronomy'* during the 43rd session of the *UNESCO General Conference*, in Uzbekistan on October 31, World Cities Day, as part of 58 additions this year to its *Creative Cities Network (UCCN)*. With this recognition, Lucknow becomes one of 408 cities across more than 100 countries that have been acknowledged for their contributions to creative industries such as crafts and folk art, design, film, gastronomy, literature, media arts and music. This year, architecture has been introduced as a new creative field within the network.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, expressing delight, invited people from around the world to visit the city and discover its uniqueness. "Lucknow is synonymous with a vibrant culture, at the core of which is a great culinary culture. I am glad that *UNESCO* has recognised this aspect of Lucknow," he wrote on X.

Indian travellers can now make UPI transactions in Malaysia

You pay in Indian Rupees (INR); the Malaysian merchant receives the payment instantly in Malaysian Ringgit (MYR). You get currency conversion without the high fees of international transactions.

Bulgaria streamlines long-term visa process for Indians



The streamlining involves a significant expansion of the application centres across India, which increases accessibility and convenience. The new partnership between the Embassy of Bulgaria in New Delhi and VFS Global handles the administrative process in multiple cities across India. Indians planning an extended stay can now submit their applications at Mumbai, Bengaluru, Chennai, Kolkata and more.

Sri Lanka revokes Electronic Travel Authorisation for travellers

With the suspension, the country reverts to its previous visa policy that was in place before October 15, 2025

THE Pearl of the Indian Ocean has suspended the mandatory pre-departure Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA) requirement, which had only taken effect on October 15, 2025. The suspension was announced just a few days later, on October 30, 2025. The new rule mandated that all travellers (for short-stay tourism or business) must obtain the ETA before boarding their flight. This added an extra, non-negotiable step to pre-travel planning.

The policy change was met with resistance from both travellers and the tourism industry, who found the sudden, mandatory pre-departure system to be an obstacle to seamless, spontaneous travel. Sri Lanka is focused on revitalising its crucial tourism sector and the reversal is a move to simplify the entry process, reduce administrative hurdles and ensure the country re-

mains an accessible and attractive destination, especially as it approaches the peak tourist season.

Some reports indicated that the new system encountered technical failures, website crashes and difficulties for travellers attempting to complete the online forms or process payments, leading to frustration and delays. As of the suspension, the country reverted to its previous visa policy that was in place before. Travellers can still apply for their ETA online before departure (which is generally recommended for a smoother process).

Eligible travellers can still obtain their ETA/visa upon arrival at the port of entry, though this may involve longer queues and potentially higher fees. The government is also reportedly considering a fee waiver for the ETA for citizens of several countries as part of a broader initiative to further boost international tourism.
